Lamar CISD Child Nutrition Free/Reduced On-line Meals Application 2020-2021

The Child Nutrition Department will be accepting on-line applications for the 2020-2021 Free/Reduced Meals Program. Parents/Guardian can apply on-line at www.schoolcafe.com beginning the second week of August 2020.

Students attending the following CEP schools DO NOT need to submit an on-line application for 2020-2021: Arredondo, Beasley, Bowie, Jackson, Jane Long, Meyer, Pink, Seguin, Smith, Taylor Ray, Travis, Velasquez, Navarro, Wessendorff, Lamar Jr. High, George Jr. High, Lamar High and Terry High. All students on these campuses are eligible for Free breakfast and Free lunch, with NO APPLICATION.

ADDITIONAL CEP CAMPUSES ADDED FOR 2020-2021 ARE: AUSTIN, CULVER, HUTCHISON, WILLIAMS, ALC AND JJAEP.

HOUSEHOLDS MUST FILL OUT AN ON-LINE APPLICATION FOR ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE (6TH), JR. HIGH (7TH & 8TH) AND HIGH SCHOOLS (9th thru 12th) NOT LISTED ABOVE TO DETERMINE IF YOUR CHILD QUALIFIES FOR FREE OR REDUCED-PRICED SCHOOL MEALS.

Non-discrimination Statement: This explains what to do if you believe you have been treated unfairly.
